1. What are the Elements of Art?

The language and terms used to communicate what we see in a work of art.

- 2. Elements of Art Definitions (Matching and Fill in the Blanks)
 - 1. Line: A mark made on a surface by a moving point
 - 2. Shape: A 2D (or flat) closed figure
 - 3. Form: A 3 dimensional (3D) closed object or figure
 - 4. Value: The lightness or darkness of a color
 - 5. Texture: The way something feels or looks like it feels
 - 6. Space: The area around, above and within an object.
 - 7. Color: What we see when light is reflected or absorbed by an object. Example: yellow, blue, purple
- 3. Be able to identify a line, shape or form.




4. Colors: Be able to identify the Primary Colors and Secondary Colors and color them on a color wheel.

Primary Colors: Yellow, Blue, Red


Secondary Colors: Green, Purple, Orange




5. Be able to create Value using a pencil (shading from light to dark) Example:

 - b. He was born in Paris France and died at the age of 32.
 - c. His most famous painting is called "A Sunday Afternoon on the Island of La Grande Jatte".
 - d. It took him 2 years to paint this painting and he used over 3 million dots.
